An AICTE sponsored FDP, Design Thinking for Social Entrepreneurship was conducted online from 5th July-9th July, 2021 by Shri Vithal Education and Research Institution (SVERI) in collaboration with Sobus Insight Forum, its social innovation partner via the SVERI's Sobus Center of Excellence. 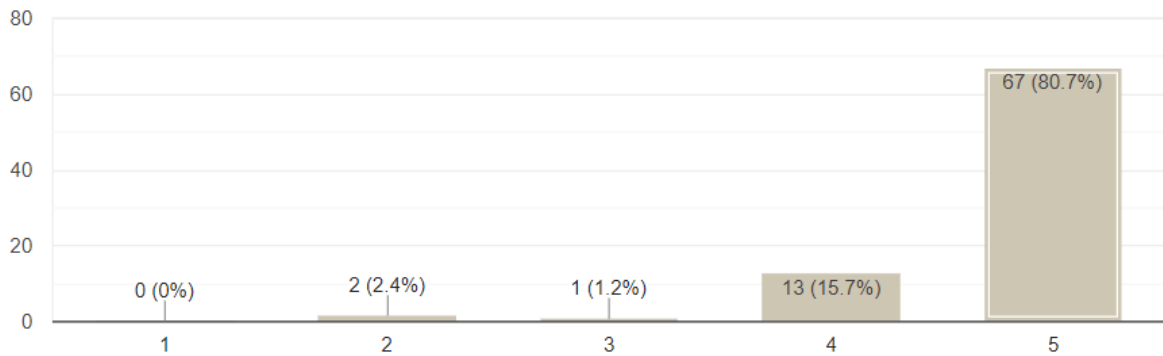

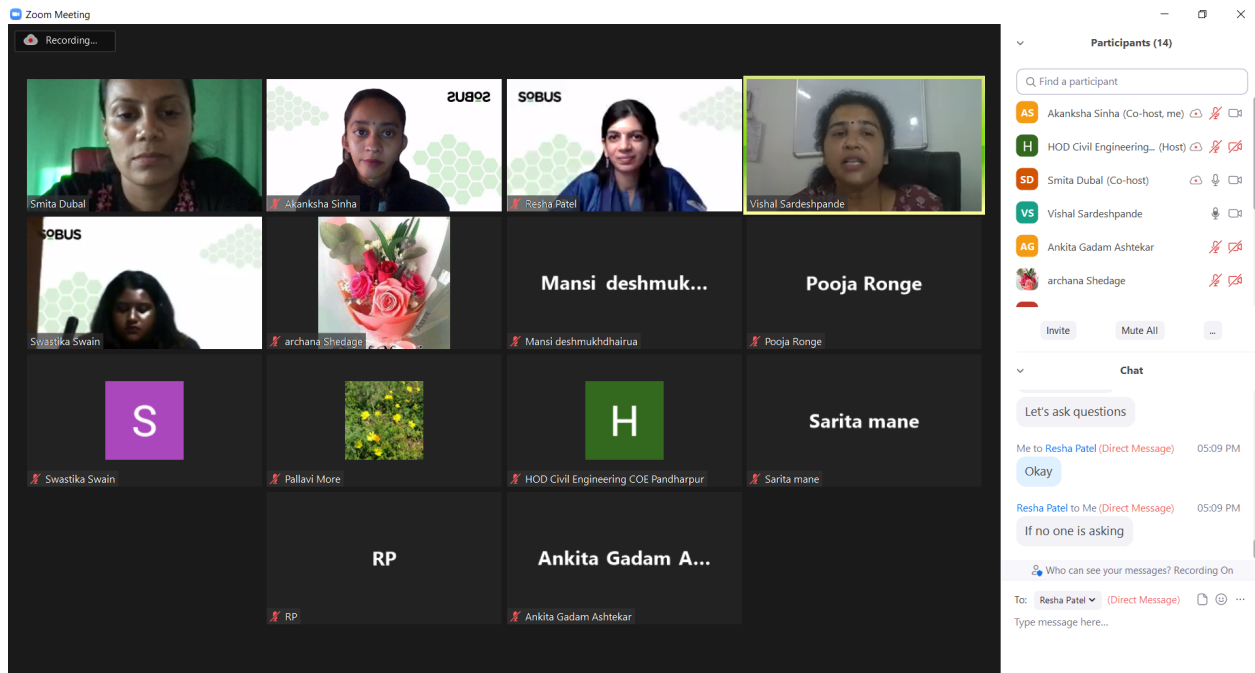




Seminar on Jaggery Entrepreneurship in Pandharpur

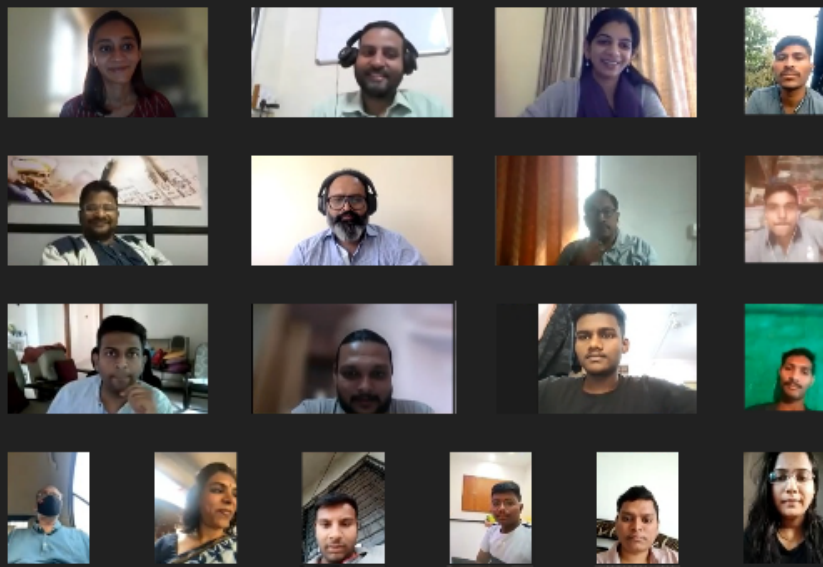

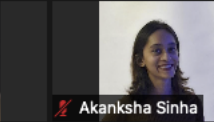
